Landesa's Advocacy Priorities

- Encourage Parties to include land rights in their updated <u>Nationally Determined Contributions</u> (NDCs) by offering technical support, sample language, and example indicators.
- Ensure that protections for land rights and land tenure are included in tools and assessments that oversee Article 6 of the Paris Agreement, especially the <u>Article 6.4 Sustainable Development</u> (SD) Tool. The Article 6.4 SD Tool is a mechanism for monitoring the social and environmental impacts of emission mitigation outcomes achieved in one country and transferred to count towards another country's NDC. We advocate for additional considerations for land rights to strengthen Principle 7: Gender Equality, Principle 8: Land Acquisition and Involuntary Resettlement, and Principle 9: Indigenous Peoples.
- Add "social integrity" to Article 6.2 of the Paris Agreement. Article 6.2. requires that countries transferring emission mitigations from one country to another "promote sustainable development and ensure environmental integrity." We urge Parties to add a requirement for "social integrity" in Article 6.2. This addition will help ensure vulnerable communities are not disproportionately affected by projects contributing to another country's NDC.
